

### Jee-nius

Did you know that the first official Jeep models were actually designed by the American Bantam Car Company in Pennsylvania for military applications? The first Jeep prototype was delivered to a U.S. Army Camp in Baltimore in 1940, but the manufacturing was ultimately taken over by Willys-Overland. When the army put out an open call for bids to car manufacturers for developing a new military-grade vehicle, Willys-Overland easily won with the first ever Jeep "Wrangler" model.
